Agenda: 11.4.4 Approval of amendment to Item No. 8.13 (Community Service Project) of the AR20 B. Tech. Academic Regulations.

The Member Secretary presented the following amendment to Item No. 8.13 (Community Service Project) of the AR20 B. Tech. Academic Regulations.

Existing	Amendment
Community Service Project is an alternative to the Summer Internship, whenever there is an exigency and students cannot pursue their Summer Internship.	A Community Service Project (CSP) is to be carried out by each student for 180 hrs during the summer break after II semester and the remaining part of CSP is to be done in the III semester weekends and holidays. The evaluation of CSP is done in III semester. The CSP is to be carried out in addition to the summer internships.

***Discussion:** The Member Secretary presented that the Community Service Project carries 4 credits, and these credits are to be reduced from the credits of Project in VIII semester, so that the total number of credits 160 is retained. The program structure of all the B.Tech programs is changed accordingly.*

The Member Secretary also presented that, as per APSCHE guidelines, the present V semester students (2020 admitted batch) are carrying out CSP in their V Semester and the evaluation is to be done in the V semester only. However, for the batches admitted from 2021 onwards, CSP is in III semester.

The Members unanimously approved the amendment to Item No. 8.13 (Community Service Project) of the AR20 B. Tech. Academic Regulations.

The Members also unanimously approved the program structures of all B.Tech programs under AR20 Regulation, after including the Community Service Project with 4 credits in III semester and Project with 8 credits in VIII semester. The members also approved the evaluation of Community Service Project for the 2020 admitted students in their V semester.

As per the letter from University dated 09-02-21, the following are the guidelines provided for the exit option in IMBA program at the end of III Year for awarding BBA degree.

1. Permitted the Exit Option for award of BBA Degree for those who have successfully completed 3 years of study of the 5 year Integrated Program.
2. Vacant seats shall be filled caused on account of such Exit option at the end of III years through Lateral Entry as per existing provisions of AICTE and UGC Regulations.
3. Students who satisfy the prescribed entry qualification for admission against vacant seats will be permitted to study for two-year MBA Degree.

Discussion: The members suggested that, for pursuing minor degree, only the entry level eligibility (i.e 7.75 CGPA upto III semester with no backlogs) is to be considered in the IV semester. Further during study of minor degree, a student should not fail in any course. The GPA of the minor degree courses is not considered, only pass or fail is considered.

Resolution No. AEC/AC/Res/11.4.6

The members unanimously resolved to ratify the results of all the examinations.

Regarding minor degree, the members approved that, for pursuing minor degree, only the entry level eligibility is considered. A student is awarded B.Tech degree in major discipline and minor degree in any specialized area, provided the student secures 160 credits in the major discipline and additional 20 credits from the courses specified under the minor degree specialization. The members also approved the credit relaxation for promotion for the a.y 2022-23.

Agenda: 11.5.3 Details of placements for the academic year 2021-22.

The Member Secretary presented the details of placements and informed that 707 students out of 882 eligible students are placed during the academic year 2021-22 with highest and average packages of 20 LPA and 4.34 LPA respectively. 155 students were selected with a package of ≥ 5.5 LPA.

Discussion: The members suggested to provide the details of students opted for higher education and for entrepreneurship.

The members noted and appreciated the same.

Agenda: 11.5.4 Introduction of CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) for the next regulations.

The members suggested to look into the issues to be considered for providing CBCS and the possibilities of implementing CBCS for the next regulation shall be discussed in the next Academic Council meeting.

The members rejected implantation of one year internship as part of curriculum. However, very few students can be permitted to go on one-year internship, provided they complete the VII semester courses through MOOCs. The members also added that as per UGC guidelines, 40% of courses can be completed through MOOCs and the assessment is to be done at the College level.

Agenda: 11.6.1.1 Paper Publications.

The Member Secretary presented the details of 78 Paper Publications of the faculty so far in the current academic year 2022-23.

Discussion: The members also advised not to discourage faculty from attending the conferences, where they will have personal interaction with their peers though it is not counted for NIRF / other agencies.

The members noted the same. The members also advised to insist the faculty to publish two papers every year so that the publication metrics can improve further.
